RECYCLING COMES TO MARCEL LAKE ESTATES

On Wednesday, October 26, 2012 we began recycling, helping to save the environment, and keeping down the cost of garbage hauling. **SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING** allows you to put glass and plastic bottles, all metal and aluminum cans, newspapers and cardboard boxes into the same container without having to sort. *PLEASE BE SURE TO BREAK DOWN ALL CARDBOARD BOXES BEFORE PLACING THEM IN THE RECYCLING BINS*. By recycling, we have been able to cut down on the tonnage of regular garbage and further reduce the cost of garbage collection. All other regular household garbage continues to go into the regular compactor.

REMEMBER, THE COMPACTOR IS NOT TO BE USED FOR APPLIANCES, FURNITURE, CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS, OR ANY OTHER BULK DEBRIS. Call the office for bulk garbage rates and disposal procedures.
